Most of our courses still have lots of spaces however, in particular the Guest Speakers programme and many of our informative talks which are held on Tuesday mornings and Thursday afternoons.


Remember that your membership entitles you to attend as many courses as you wish, and that you can continue to enrol throughout the year.

Tues 1.00 - 3.30pm (4 sessions)



LAUGHTER IS THE BEST MEDICINE




An optimist stays up until midnight to see the new year in. A pessimist stays up to make sure the old year leaves.

A. Synonym rolls.




Q: How many actors does it take to change a light bulb?
